## Urban Tea Loft to brew in Chandler

The Urban Tea Loft, a hip alternative to the traditional Victorian teahouse, is coming to downtown Chandler.

The cafe and restaurant, which will open in September or October, will be at 11 W. Boston St. Urban Tea Loft will be owned and operated by Glynis and Eric Legrand, and will feature more than 100 teas from around the world. The cafe will also have meeting rooms for rent that are equipped with LCD television screens.

The cafe's menu will include alcoholic drinks such as the "teatini," which is a concoction of tea and gin or vodka. "We're not Victorian in nature at all," said Glynis.
